#### Notes to Financial Statement for the year ended 31st March, 2020

#### A SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### A1 Accounting Concepts, Conventions & Systems

a) The Accounts have been prepared on historical cost convention under accrual method of accounting and in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India as recommended by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India.

b) The Company generally follows mercantile system of accounting and recognizes income and expenditure on accrual basis except those with significant uncertainties. These statements are in accordance with the requirements of Companies Act, 2013 and comply in all material aspects with the Accounting Standards notified u/s 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 and the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 2013.

#### A2 Fixed Assets & Depreciation

a) Fixed Assets are stated at cost (of acquisition/ construction, as the case may be) net of CENVAT (if any), less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses, if any. All cost including borrowing cost up to the date of commissioning of related assets and all direct and indirect expenses attributable to the assets are capitalized.

b) Depreciation on Fixed Assets (if any) has been provided on straight line method, at the rates prescribed as per schedule II of the Companies Act, 2013, except on the assets, which are still under work in progress stage.
